Export Controls and Compliance



Manchester, April 6: AEB SAP® Packaged Services initiative kicks off at Old Trafford Football Stadium

On April 6, 2011, as part of the AEB SAP® Packaged Services initiative, AEB International Ltd will take part in a roadshow in cooperation with SAP Consulting at the Old Trafford Football Stadium in Manchester. Government agencies around the world have published lists of individuals, companies and organizations they believe to be engaged in terrorist activities. Some of these lists run hundreds of pages long, so manual checks of denied-party lists are time-consuming, impractical and prone to error.

During the event, Iqbal will demonstrate how AEB’s Denied-Party Address Screening module provides automated real-time checks of addresses in all relevant business objects and transactions directly within the SAP system. Sanctions against Libya

The European Union imposed sanctions against Libya through [Council Decision 2011/137/CFSP of February 28, 2011](#). Ambassadors of all 27 EU member states were unanimous in calling for sanctions against the Libyan regime of Muammar al-Gaddafi. The sanctions include an embargo on arms and all goods that could be used to suppress the population. The restrictions also include the freezing of bank accounts and travel bans. The embargo extends to weapons and munitions, military vehicles and equipment, paramilitary equipment and spare parts. No equipment that could be used for torture may be exported to Libya. All funds, financial assets and economic resources held or controlled by the persons and organizations named in Annexes III and IV of the Council Decision are frozen. Another list in the annex of the decision names the persons who are prohibited from traveling into or through the sovereign territories of EU member states. The
